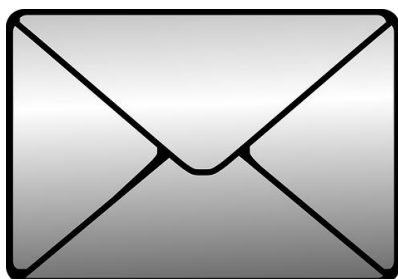

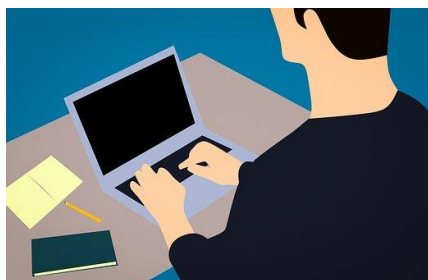

What is a Strategic Equality Plan?

Equality is about treating everyone fairly



The law says that Bridgend Council must treat everyone fairly



We have a Strategic Equality Plan to make sure it does what the law says

A plan says what will happen.



The plan says what we will do to make sure everyone is treated fairly and with respect.

Some people may be treated more unfairly and should be protected. This includes:



People of different ages – younger people or older people

Transgender people.

Transgender people are born as one sex and want to live as the other sex. For example, a person who looks like a man may feel inside like a woman.



Women who are pregnant or have recently given birth.



People of different religions or who have no religious beliefs



People who are **lesbian, gay men** and bisexual people.

Lesbians are women who are attracted to other women

Gay men are men who are attracted to other men



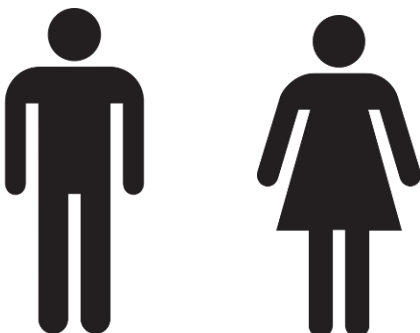
People who have a disability

If they are a man or a woman

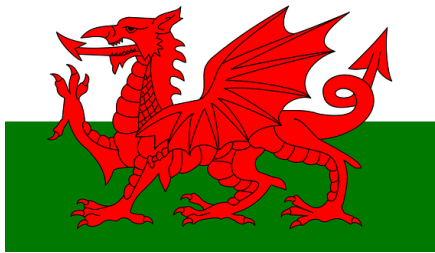


Wellbeing

An objective is a goal we want to achieve.

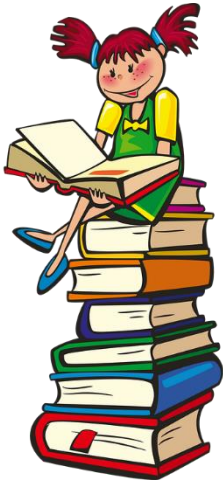


Having 6 goals to work towards will help us know if things are fairer for people.

- Taking part



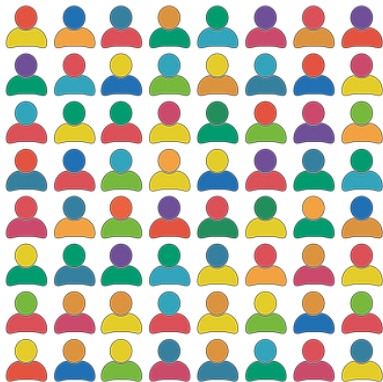


Education

Work

Being inclusive means including everyone no matter who they are or what their background is.



Living standards

We want to help people who are living in poverty.



Health and wellbeing

We want people who live in Bridgend and work at the council to have happy and healthy lives.



Safety

We want people who live in Bridgend to be safe. We don't want people to worry about violence or bullying.



Taking part

We want people who live in Bridgend to get involved in decisions we are making.

All the staff working at the council and local councillors are in charge of making sure the plan happens.
