Notice of Adoption of a Local Development Plan Bridgend Local Development Plan 2006 - 2021

On 18th September 2013 Bridgend County Borough Council adopted a Local Development Plan (LDP) for Bridgend County Borough. The adopted LDP will form the development plan for Bridgend County Borough and will be the basis for decisions on land use planning in this area.

Copies of the adopted LDP, the recommendations of the person appointed to hold the independent examination, the sustainability appraisal report (incorporating the environmental report), the consultation report and a statement indicating how the environmental report etc. has been taken into account are available for inspection free of charge at the Customer Service Centre, Bridgend County Borough Council, Civic Offices, Angel Street, Bridgend, CF31 4WB and all public libraries in Bridgend County Borough during their normal opening hours.

They are also available on the Council's website at www.bridgend.gov.uk/ldp.

Copies of the LDP, including its proposal map, will be available for purchase from the Customer Service Centre, Bridgend County Borough Council, Civic Offices, Angel Street, Bridgend, CF31 4WB.

The LDP became operative on its adoption (i.e. 18th September 2013).

A person aggrieved by the LDP who desires to question its validity on the ground that it is not within the powers conferred by Part 6 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 or that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made under it has not been complied with in relation to the adoption of the LDP, may, within six weeks from 26th September 2013, make an application to the High Court under Section 113 of the 2004 Act.
