

BRIDGEND COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS, BRIDGEND)(PROHIBITION OF ENTRY)(VARIATION)(REVOCATION) ORDER 2026

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Bridgend County Borough Council (hereinafter referred to as “the Council”) being the Highway Authority for Bridgend have made an Order in exercise of their powers under Sections 1 and 2 and Part IV of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (“the Act”) as amended and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act the effect of which is to vary the orders listed in the schedule below.

The purpose of the Order is to:-

- (i) remove the no entry restriction on Cae Dre Street at its junction with Park Street.
- (ii) remove the no entry restriction on Sunnyside Road at the north side of its junction with Rice Street. This will allow vehicles travelling along Sunnyside Road from its junction with Angel Street to the north side of its junction with Rice Street, to enter Sunnyside Road from the north side of its junction with Rice Street to its closed end.
- (iii) remove the no entry restriction on Sunnyside Road at the north side of its junction with Rice Street. This will allow vehicles travelling along Rice Street from the bypass, to enter that length of Sunnyside Road from the north side of its junction with Rice Street, to its closed end.

The order was made on the 11/02/2026 and will come into force on the 27/02/2026.

If any person wishes to question the validity of any Order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Act or that any requirement of the Act or of any instrument made under the Act has not been complied with, that person may, within six weeks from the date on which the Order is made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.

The council welcomes receiving correspondence in Welsh, any correspondence received in Welsh will be answered in Welsh and corresponding in Welsh will not lead to a delay in responding.
