

BRIDGEND COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS, BRIDGEND)(PROHIBITION OF ENTRY)(VARIATION)(REVOCATION) ORDER 202-

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Bridgend County Borough Council (hereinafter referred to as “the Council”) being the Highway Authority for Bridgend in exercise of their powers under Sections 1 and 2 and Part IV of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (“the Act”) as amended and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act intend to make an Order the effect of which is to vary the orders listed in the schedule below.

The purpose of the proposed Order is to:-

- (i) remove the no entry restriction on Cae Dre Street at its junction with Park Street.
- (ii) remove the no entry restriction on Sunnyside Road at the north side of its junction with Rice Street. This will allow vehicles travelling along Sunnyside Road from its junction with Angel Street to the north side of its junction with Rice Street, to enter Sunnyside Road from the north side of its junction with Rice Street to its closed end.
- (iii) remove the no entry restriction on Sunnyside Road at the north side of its junction with Rice Street. This will allow vehicles travelling along Rice Street from the bypass, to enter that length of Sunnyside Road from the north side of its junction with Rice Street, to its closed end.
